“Love has thousand doors. But one sided love isn't a door, it's a myth” (p. 6).

Yunes tells the tale of her love with Siham. He relates himself to princes like Hamlet. The hamlet lived in a rotten nation and lived in a rotten kingdom. My father died in a hamlet, and my father died. Hamlet went mad due to the fact he changed into incapable of taking revenge, and i am on the verge of going mad because someone desires to take revenge on me.

Abu Ma, Rouf lost his wife throughout the Israeli bombing of Saffouri. He faced the whilst he wants to get married again. He changed into married to a refugee woman, however after the wedding, she became the depressing a part of his lifestyles.

“You don’t recognize women. You should by no means tell women about the others. If girls doesn’t assume she is the center of your existence, she will be able to became miserable and make your existence depressing, too” (p. 77).
